Many year 11 parents attended an event arranged by Miss Kingston about support and guidance that they can offer their children during exams. A really well attended event. Thank you for your support.


We have had a visit from the school therapy dog (in training)—a very popular addition!

We are Lyng Hall - Therapy Dog Shadow

It is said that owning a dog can significantly improve your quality and longevity of life and that pets can support our health.

In one 2019 review published in an American Heart Association journal, the authors (led by Caroline K. Kramer, MD, PhD) found that dog ownership was associated with a 24% risk reduction for all-cause mortality compared to non-ownership.



Our dogs are, quite literally, helping us live longer!



Black History Month originated in the US and was first celebrated in the UK in 1987. The intention of Black History Month is to celebrate the contributions of black people within world history.


Black History Month offers us many opportunities to engage with black history. Examples might include:

Mr Veal will lead the project. More details to follow up soon.






Thank you to Mr Veal for leading the assembly this week. These 2 slides capture the essence of our focus.
