JONNIE PEACOCK



Lyng Hall recently won a competition through Sure Breaking Limits. The prize was the opportunity to meet Jonnie Peacock—Paralympic gold medalist sprinter. Jonnie is known for his outstanding achievements in athletics and has become a powerful advocate for inclusivity and overcoming challenges. He has won Paralympic, World and European, sprint titles between 2012 and 2014 and safely retained his Paralympic crown at Rio 2016.

The event began with Jonnie delivering a speech on how he 'got into' sprinting, the barriers he faced and how he overcame them to reach high levels of success in competitions. His story was very inspiring to our pupils and hopefully inspired them to never doubt themselves or give up on their dreams. Pupils were able to ask Jonnie questions, to learn more



about him and gain an insight into his personal life and opinions. Following this, our pupils took part in a movement workshop.

During the workshop, pupils completed an obstacle course 3 times but, each time, it was adapted slightly. They had to bounce a tennis ball on a racket, dribble a ball in and out of cones, then throw a beanbag to knock a tennis ball off a cone. On



the first occasion of completing the activity, pupils could move as freely as they wished and were familiar with. The second time round, pupils were instructed to place a tennis ball in-between their elbow or, behind their knee; meaning use of one of their arms or legs was taken away. Pupils had to think creatively on how they could overcome this barrier, so that they could still participate and complete the obstacle course. On the third occasion, pupils were asked to work in pairs with one person having to cover their eyes. This relied on good teamwork skills but also, innovative thinking to adapt parts of the obstacle course to make it safe and possible to complete. The workshop was really educational and pupils could recognise how participation in sport may 'look different' for some individuals but, it is always possible. We should not be 'put off' by barriers but should seek ways to overcome them! The pupils involved represented the school well. We were very proud and eager for them to share what they have learned with their peers.

Vocational level in Hospitality and Catering

Over the last fortnight, 30 year 11 students have completed the practical component of their course based on a brief set by the exam body. Students

have created dishes such as macaroni cheese, ciabatta, fish cakes, lasagne and fish bites. Along with side dishes such as duchess potatoes, chips, coleslaw, garlic bread and vegetable bundles. It's been amazing to watch the students excel in the kitchen and show their confidence with their skills and precision.



GCSE Photography

Photography students have been working hard on their GCSE portfolio work which has led to a final piece that they have created in a their mock examination. The themes that students have been working on are

reinterpretation and double exposure. Students were tasked to take an artist's work or a magazine cover and reinterpret it into their own idea. Double exposure work is the idea of combining two images to make a new, interesting design. Some of the artists that students looked at were Matisse and Van Gogh.



GCSE Art and Design

Students studying Art and Design have been working on a project based on Ancient Greece. They have explored Greek sculpture, drawing and ceramics as well as Greek architecture. Students have been working on creating their own work based on these themes and completed a Mock examination to create a final piece.

The two faces are representational of what we see on the outside vs what the feelings are on the inside... how other people see us on the outside vs how we feel about ourselves on the inside.




