What is Ramadan?

- Ramadan is the Holy Month when the Qur'aan was sent down from Allah (God) as a revelation to the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him).
- Muslims around the world fast during the day – from dawn to sunset without eating or drinking during this time.



When is Ramadan?

Ramadan is a month on the lunar calendar (it is based on the sighting of the moon).

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said,

"When you see the crescent (of the month of Ramadan), start fasting, and when you see the crescent (again), stop fasting; and if the sky is cloudy (and you can't see it) then regard the month of Ramadan as of 30 days."

Pi Day 14th March 2024

On March 14th every year mathematicians across the world celebrate Pi.

So what is Pi?

Pi (π) , one of the most well-known mathematical constants, is the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter. For any circle, the distance around the edge is a little more than three times the distance across. We often abbreviate it to 3.14 but in fact it is an irrational number so has no end and no repeating pattern. Here at Lyng Hall we decided to join in the celebrations and learn more about Pi throughout the week.

Tutor Time Activities


During tutor time we celebrated Pi by understanding where Pi is used in








College – Update


