

We have already built 80 houses for child-headed or vulnerable families. Each home costs us £4,800 to build, a small amount for a lifetime of security for these families.

Beyond just a roof, we ensure that each child has a bed, warm blankets and even a hand-knitted Teddy from our lovely 'Knitting Nannies' making them feel safe, secure and loved.

#### Democracy in action!

This Summer Term year 8 have been learning about the history, and the significance of suffrage, within Great Britain. At Lyng, students learn about the importance of democracy as one of our Fundamental British Values within contemporary British society. Not only do students learn about democracy, we take actively take part in the democratic process!



With the upcoming general elections, year 12 law students had taken it upon themselves to represent different political parties and share their manifestos to year 8 recognising why suffrage is still an important part of British society today. All students had 3 minutes to pitch their presentations, followed by a brief Q&A before year 8 placed their votes on Tuesday afternoon.

Recently, a few students from the post-16 BTEC Law class have supported and delivered a mock election for year 8s to support both our learning and theirs.

Year 8 has been learning about the fundamental British values, especially democracy, in their humanity lessons and a key part of our unit 2 coursework has been how parliament works, can be influenced and what the results of poor parliamentary control are. Montesquieu's principle of the separation of powers is one example of a theme we explored alongside the roles of political and legal professionals, and how factors such as the media, pressure groups and whips can distort the action which parliament chooses to take through their democratic voting.

Democracy is a key fundamental British value that we feel is important to be taught young, and this is the perfect opportunity to give an interesting and practical way for year 8 to understand what democratic rights they will be afforded once they are 18 (or 16 locally). It is no doubt that the democratic process of first past the post is confusing, so we have streamlined the depth of content we delivered to ensure that clarity and age appropriateness were maintained.

First, the post-16 students delivered their 'campaigns' for their parties via teams with a set time restriction to ensure fairness. Once all campaigns had been delivered, a Q and A session was pencilled in to give year 8 a chance to ask questions after they had time to reflect. This was beneficial to us as post-16 students due to the fact we got a chance to practice critical thinking and public speaking skills, which are key to our coursework when analysing cases and doing presentations verbally. Once the Q and A ended, a ballot box was taken around with ballot papers and a concealed vote was made. These votes were then counted twice to ensure accuracy before the results were announced.







# College - Update






# College – Update
